Starting point...

- We believe that every child should have the opportunity to reach their full learning potential
- Food, farming and the countryside offers a platform to do this
- Research report published in February 2016
- Continued research and consultation



What we found out...

- It's a cluttered market >150 separate activities in Norfolk =little coordination, duplication, inefficient, unfocussed =inconsistent quality, limited reach, fails to meet learning target
- Greater focus on EYFS/KS 1 & 2 = primary is easier, HLS box ticked
- Gaps and inconsistency in the more structured frameworks of KS3-5
 = secondary is tough
- National initiatives are great, but need local effort
- Teachers need help!



Something must be done...

- Enable demand
 - = teacher led approaches, clear links to educational outcomes, relevant and attractive to schools
- Mind the gap!
 - = fill in gaps in provision, link the work at secondary and yrs 12/13
 - = create bridges between learning to skills and careers
- Better alignment between schools and F/HE providers
- Strengthen provision
 - = collaborate, develop new relationships
 - = be a force multiplier
- Communicate
- Secure long term funding



So – what are we doing?

- Establish an independent and neutral regional hub to lead activity at ground level the Food and Farming Discovery Trust
- Initial scope Norfolk
- Helping to ensure that current provision is better coordinated, resourced and aligned with the National Curriculum
- Pushing national resources and activities (FACE/AHDB/LEAF) at local level exploit / expand
- Raising awareness and understanding on the issues that underpin our everyday lives
 working with others at local level (UEA/Active Norfolk)
- Raising awareness and support for career opportunities and routes into the industry (E&OC, CCN, AF, NALEP).

How we are doing it

- Established a project office hosted by the RNAA
 - Point of contact for schools, providers and industry



- Building a network for teachers and understanding their needs
- Maintaining and developing current provision, introduce new events, activities and resources and encourage new collaborations and partnerships
- Promoting opportunities using Countryside Classroom portal
- Acting as central point to recruit volunteers for events


