## AFCP FORUMS

Because of the uncertainties created by COVID-19 we have, somewhat reluctantly, decided that our two regional events timetabled for this autumn will be held by video conferencing.

These will provide an opportunity to hear about some of our jointly funded studentships.

For the **South West Region**, on **October 8<sup>th</sup>**, Bobby Hyde will discuss his work on **calf health** and Luke O'Grady will talk about plans for a newly-funded project on **carbon emissions from dairy production systems**, and hopefully introduce the research student, Fern Baker, who will be carrying out the research.

In the **Eastern Region**, on **October 12<sup>th</sup>**, George Crane will report on his **research on soil health**. Thanks to additional funding from both the AHDB and from AFCP charities, George has been able to extend his project for 6 months, until the middle of 2021, to compensate for the disruption caused by the lockdown. We hope that we may get the opportunity for a face-to-face meeting before he finishes his research.

**The oilseed rape forum** which was planned for last spring has now been re-timetabled for **Thursday April 8<sup>th</sup> 2021** at the **University of Hertfordshire**. There will be more details nearer the time.

Our **biennial Student Forum** is planned to be held at **Cranfield University** at the **end of June or early July 2021**. As in the past, all students funded or part-funded by charities will be invited and given the opportunity to present their work. Charities will be sent further information once the date and other details have been finalised.

The **biennial National Forum** is at an early stage of planning but we hope to hold it at a land-based college with a programme which will relate directly to college interests.

## OPPORTUNITIES FOR FUNDING

### Digitising of the Brighton Crop Protection Conferences

In the last Newsletter, we included details of a project which the British Crop Production Council plans to undertake to digitise the proceedings of the crop protection conferences held annually from 1954 in a fully searchable format. To date, four AFCP charities have donated a total of **£5.5K** towards this project, for which the BCPC is very grateful.

Many charity trustees and others will have benefited from 'Brighton Conferences' and other charities may see this as a great opportunity to ensure this knowledge is available to future generations. ### Support for agribusinesses in Scotland

Firstport's LaunchMe programme is a business support and investment readiness programme that helps ambitious Scottish social enterprises to scale and make a greater impact. Below are brief details of three of the businesses they are currently supporting, where they are looking for additional funds:

#### 1. Sustainable Thinking Scotland CIC – contact Sean Kerr [sean.stscic@gmail.com](mailto:sean.stscic@gmail.com)

Sustainable Thinking Scotland CIC address a wide range of social and environmental issues within the Falkirk area. They grow fruit and vegetables for the local foodbank, run recycling services, school education programmes and are pioneering biochar production for use as a fertiliser in their food production and for water remediation.

They are seeking funding to develop a community orchard. The project aims to engage disadvantaged members of the community in growing food, healthy eating and outdoor exercise and will include a targeted schools programme for local children living in the bottom 5% of the Scottish Index of Multiple Deprivation. They have applied to the Central Scotland Green Network Fund for £7,500 and need match funding of £5,000.

Farmer Jones Academy CIC, based in Tain in the Highlands, provides foundation and modern apprenticeships to young people. They aim to combat rural deprivation by creating positive destinations for young people at risk of unemployment.

They are in the process of developing their own training base whilst also working within communities to develop outdoor learning spaces where they can deliver a variety of programmes. They are expanding their training portfolio with SQA wider achievement courses and are in the process of becoming an accredited Prince's Trust Centre.

Woodside Arran CIC is a community permaculture farm on the Isle of Arran. They provide sustainable, affordable fresh produce to the local community whilst advocating and educating about local food resilience, regenerative agriculture practices, healthy nutrition.

In May 2020 Woodside Arran was approached to become an anchor organisation for the Coronavirus Community Fund. Their application was successful, allowing them to create a whole new “food bank garden”, which has expanded their growing space by 400%.
