Awareness and understanding of potential benefits

- Shared (delegated) administration and management
- Opportunity to contribute to larger, more effective(?) projects
- More direct link to industry strategies
- Easier for 'service providers' and fund seekers to team up.

Awareness of opportunities

- Multiple announcements and time tables
- Single point of access to 'calling notices'

Compatibility of processes

- Applications
- Evaluation
- Approvals
- Schedules

Key stages for coordination

- ideally with common dates

- Announcement
- Concept proposal/submission
- Concept 'exchange clearance'
- Collaboration in place
- Project approved (contract in place)

Components of primary application

- Title
- The project
 - *The problem/issue*
 - *Relevance to industry*
 - *Aim of project*
 - *Key objectives*
 - *Outline of activities*
 - *Key outcomes*
 - *Knowledge transfer*
- Lead applicant
- Host institution(s)
- Project duration
- Proposed start date
- Total cost
- Potential co-funding /collaboration
